Privacy policy

This is the privacy policy of Choose Radio and their legal successors.

This policy explains our approach to digital information collection, storage and use in connection with all our digital content. We are committed to protecting your privacy. Choose Radio will ensure that it keeps all personal data you provide to us in accordance with our obligations under the Data Protection Acts 1988 to 2018 and General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) (EU 2016/679).

This policy applies to Choose Radio digital services only and not to other websites, APPs, social media sites linked to or from Choose Radio digital services.

1. The information we collect

Choose Radio will never collect any unnecessary personal data from you and will not process your information in any way, other than as specified in this notice.

The personal data that Choose Radio collects if you if you make direct contact can be:

- Name
- Email
- Contact Phone Number

Choose Radio collects your personal data when you;

- fill out a contact form on our website
- email the company
- contact the company directly

Automatic Data Collection

Choose Radio use cookies to track the performance on our website.

Google Services

Choose Radio uses Google Analytics to monitor the usage of it's digital assets, this is based on legitimate interest and is an essential part of the running of any website. It provides the information we require to manage our server capacity and the popularity of our content. This information is anonymous. Social Media

You should be aware that you may be making available personally identifiable information about yourself when you submit material to our social media pages or to other interactive elements of our digital services.

2. How we use the personal data we collect:

Choose Radio takes your privacy very seriously and will never disclose, share or sell your data without your consent; unless required to do so by law. We only retain your data for as long as is necessary and for the purpose(s) specified in this notice.

We do not employ automated decision-making methods to any of your personal data stored.

The purposes and reasons for processing your personal data are detailed below: -

- We collect your personal data that you provide us with when you contact us directly to respond to your specific inquiry or to administer the relevant site activity where we have a legitimate interest.
- Comply with legal regulatory requirements and legitimate business purposes

3. Your Rights

You have the right to access any personal information that Choose Radio processes about you and to request information about: -

- What personal data we hold about you
- The purposes of the processing
- The categories of personal data concerned
- The recipients to whom the personal data has/will be disclosed
- How long we intend to store your personal data for
- If we did not collect the data directly from you, information about the source

You have the right of rectification – you have a right to correct data that we hold about you that is inaccurate or incomplete.

You have the right to be forgotten – in certain circumstances you can ask for the data we hold about you to be erased from our records.

You have the right to restriction of processing – where certain conditions apply to have a right to restrict the processing.

You have the right of portability – you have the right to have the data we hold about you transferred to another organisation.

You have the right to object – you have the right to object to certain types of processing such as direct marketing.

You have the right to object to automated processing, including profiling

If we receive a request from you to exercise any of the above rights, we may ask you to verify your identity before acting on the request; this is to ensure that your data is protected and kept secure.

4. Sharing and Disclosing Your Personal Information

We do not share or disclose any of your personal information without your consent, other than for the purposes specified in this policy or where there is a legal requirement.

5. Our commitment to security

Choose Radio takes your privacy seriously, we employ appropriate technical and organisational security measures to prevent unauthorised access, alteration, disclosure or destruction of your information.

We use the following industry standard methods to protect your data:

- SSL (HTTPS) Across all websites
- Encryption
- Enterprise firewalls

Unfortunately, the sending of information via the internet is not completely secure. Although we will do our utmost to protect your information, we cannot guarantee the security of your data sent to our digital services within Choose Radio ; any sending of information is therefore at your own risk.

6. Transfer Outside the EEA

Choose Radio do not use services that may be hosted/stored outside the EEA .

7. How Long We Keep Your Data

Choose Radio only ever retains personal information for as long as is necessary to provide the service you have.

We have retention policies in place to meet these obligations.

8. Complaints

In the event that you wish to make a complaint about how your personal data is being processed by Choose Radio, or how your complaint has been handled, you have the right to lodge a complaint directly with the Data Protection Commissioner and Choose Radio.
